My Fair Lady - Synopsis

Book and lyrics by Alan Jay Lerner; Music by Frederick Loewe Staged by Moss Hart, Based on Bernard Shaw's Pygmalion First produced at the Mark Hellinger Theatre on 15th March, 1956, with Rex Harrison as "Higgins", Julie Andrews as "Eliza" and Stanley Holloway as "Doolittle".

Scene: London outside Covent Garden of a blustery Edwardian(1901-1910) evening. Dapper young Freddy Eynsford-Hill is arriving to the opera and he treads on the flowers of Eliza Doolittle, a cockney flower merchant. She protests volubly! Meanwhile Professor Henry Higgins is watching and writing down her speech in a little notebook. Eliza suspects Higgins of being a policeman (a "tec") however he shows off his expertise in dialects ("can place any Englishman within six miles of his home by the quality of his speech"). Higgins laments that the English are incapable of speaking their own language correctly ("Why Can't the English?"). Colonel Pickering, who also studies speech, and Higgins make a wager whether Higgins can transform Eliza into a duchess in six months by speech, manners and dress. Eliza dreams of what the good life might be like ("Wouldn't It Be Loverly").

The next morning Eliza's father Doolittle prevails on Eliza to give him some money (for drink), after which he jubilantly gives voice to his general philosophy of life ("With a Little Bit of Luck"). Eliza calls on Professor Higgins and goes to live in his house while taking lessons. The next day Doolittle calls. Higgins convinces both her and her father (with some money) that Eliza's virtue is safe and that he has no romantic interest in her or any woman ("I'm an Ordinary Man").

After endless lessons in speech ("Just You Wait", "The Servants' Chorus") Eliza manages to drop her cockney accent and they celebrate ("The Rain+ in Spain"). At the Ascot races ("Ascot Gavotte") Eliza appears with Higgins. She is instructed to stick to the topics of the weather and everybody's health. Eliza instantly captures the heart of young Freddy, Freddy later haunts Higgins' house for a sight of Eliza ("On the Street Where You Live"). Eliza has a final test at the Hungarian embassy waltz. She is admired and dances gracefully ("Embassy Waltz") with the prince and with Higgins. She carries herself off triumphantly as a lady when she is taken for a Hungarian of royal blood.

My Fair Lady - Synopsis

Later Eliza recalls the pleasures of that evening ("I Could Have Danced All Night"). But she turns angrily upon Higgins for not allowing her to remain a flower salesgirl. Higgins suggests she marry some nice young man. Eliza packs and storms out of Higgins' house to stumble outside into Freddy who professes his love for her ("Show me"). Eliza returns to the flower mart but is not recognized, even by her own father. He tells her that he is about to get married ("Get Me to the Church on Time").

Higgins misses Eliza but concludes that men are far superior to women ("A Hymn to Him"). He next meets Eliza at his mother's house and tells her that he would like her to come back. He loses his temper and calls her a fool when he learns that Freddy has asked Eliza to marry him. They argue ("Without You"). At his home Higgins is lonely without Eliza ("I've Grown Accustomed to Her Face"). Eliza comes in. When he finally notices her he barks: "Eliza! Where the devil are my slippers?!"
